ABOUT OUR SERVICES

Child Care Resource & Referral (CCR&R) refers to an interrelated set of services for families, child care providers, employers, and communities that:

*

Facilitate access to early care and education and school-age child care options for families Improve the quality of child care options

Provide information for planning and policy development to the public and private sectors

Our CCR&R not only serves the far west North Carolina Counties of Cherokee, Clay, Graham, Haywood, Jackson, Macon, Swain and the Qualla Boundary (known as Region A), it also provides services and support to other CCR&R's in Buncombe, Henderson, Madison, Polk, Rutherford and Transylvania Counties.



This 13 county service area is known as the NC CCR&R Region 8.

Additionally, our agency was designated by the NC Division of Child Development and Early Education as a NC CCR&R Council Management Agency. In this capacity, agency staff provide leadership for statewide CCR&R Special Initiatives, guidance in policy and advocacy work for the NC CCR&R system and provide management and support to other CCR&R Regional Lead Agencies within the NC CCR&R system. CCR&R team members also support national work through representation on boards and committees.

In its multi-dimensional role across many systems, our focus is on providing the following services:

- Technical assistance to child care providers and community partners
- Professional development to child care providers and community partners
- Consumer education services to families and community partners
- Family services that support resiliency confidence
- Sponsorship of programs to support children's nutritional health
- Guidance and systems support that focuses on diverse needs of caregivers
